Course Catalog Description

Preserve your history through pictures. Develop skills using Adobe Photoshop Elements computer software to edit digital images and prepare photos for the Internet (web or e-mail). We'll supply the photos and teach you the techniques to work with your own pictures. Students should have basic computer skills.

Course Objectives and/or Course Topics

- Familiarity with the workspace. (Toolbar, Palettes, Layers)
- Choosing between basic image formats. (jpeg, gif, tiff or pict, psd)
- Saving formats for use or printing.
- Making basic correction of lightness and darkness using Levels.
- Selecting an area of the image using all the selection tools.
- Creating a simple vignette. (Control-j or Command-j)
- Choosing a color using the color picker, Hue and Saturation.
- Correct or (edit) an image using the clone tool, the magic brush, the blur and sharpen filters and special lighting effects.
- Create a web gallery of images for uploading.
- Create a contact sheet of images.

There are no required assignments in this class, but you are encouraged to develop your own projects to focus on.

This class is not a correspondence course, please attend class & practice at home.

The class is action-packed. Please follow instructions.

We review lessons multiple times, so don't worry if you don't get it the first time.
